Wolf Trap National Park for the Performing Arts is a majestic natural setting for over 100 performances across all genres every summer.

Home to the architecturally stunning **Filene Center**, intimate **Meadow Stage**, and charming **Children's Theatre-in-the-Woods**, the 117-acre Park offers dining and hospitality amenities throughout the summer season and year-round recreational opportunities, including hiking trails, picnic areas, and sledding.

Following the 50th anniversary in 2021, Wolf Trap Foundation embarked on several capital improvements to enhance the patron and artist experience. These updates continue in 2025 with new Main and Encore Gate entrances, as well as the addition of overhead fans in the Filene Center. Additional recent updates include:

- Meadow Commons with upgraded Concessions, elevators, lounge, and more
- Permanent covered Pavilions and accessible picnic areas
- Security perimeter

- Improved accessibility enhanced seating, aisles, crosswalks, and elevators
- Refresh of the Filene Center's exterior
- Renovated backstage artist areas
- New sound system
